## Richard Martin: Institution as Acolyte – another step towards Ordination...

## Dear Parish Family

I continue to be moved and humbled by the interest, support, encouragement and prayers of so many of you as I continue on my path towards Ordination next Summer, God willing – thank you so much.

Having been instituted as **Lector** in May this year, the next formal step is to be instituted as **Acolyte**, which will happen at St Joseph's during Mass on **Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> November**. Fr Paul will conduct the short ceremony on behalf of Bishop Philip.

In February 2025 at St Mary's College, Oscott, there will be a **final formal review/assessment** of my progress and the bishop will then decide whether or not to invite me for ordination.

I then make a final **Oath of Fidelity** and **Profession of Faith** in a short service at Oscott in May 2025, before completing my formal studies in June.

My **Ordination as Permanent Deacon** by the bishop will take place (God willing...) at **Portsmouth Cathedral** one Saturday or Sunday in **June or July 2025** (date still to be announced).

## \*What is an Acolyte?

The Acolyte is instituted for **service at the altar** and to **assist the Priest**. It is his place principally to **prepare the altar and the sacred vessels** and to distribute the Eucharist to the faithful as an **extraordinary minister**.

The instituted Acolyte helps the Priest to **purify and arrange the sacred vessels** and **assists the priest/deacon** as needed, at Mass and in other liturgical celebrations. He helps to receive the **gifts** and bring them to the altar and, if **incense** is used, the Acolyte assists the priest with this and incenses the priest and people.

Once I have been instituted as Acolyte, you will see me on the sanctuary more often, carrying out my roles as both Acolyte and Lector.
